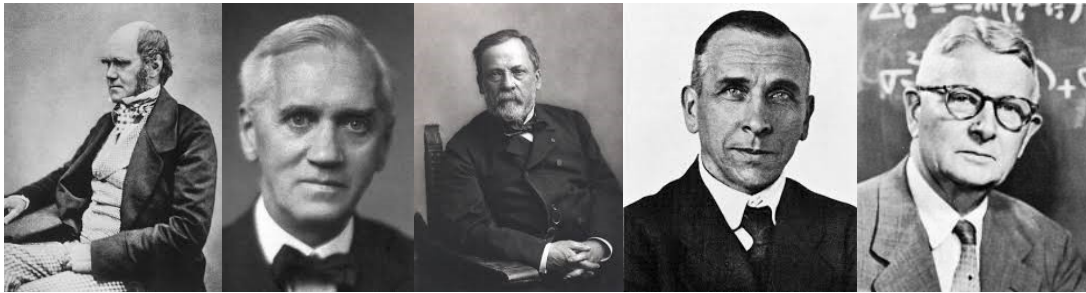


Notable Scientists Zebra Puzzle

Dates of Birth: 27 Dec 1822, 12 Feb 1809, 6 Aug 1881, 21 Dec 1889, 1 Nov 1880

Clues:

The German is next to the American

The Naturalist is left of the Physician who discovered Penicillin

The Scotsman is right of the Englishman

The discoverer of Penicillin is left of the Microbiologist

Continental Drift discoverer is right of Pasteur

The 1881 birth year is between those of 1809 (left) and 1822 (right)

Wegener is a German

The Geneticist was born in 1889

Fleming was a Physician

The person who mentioned “mutations” is right of the man who discovered Continental Drift

The discoverer of Natural Selection talked about “grandeur”

The person in the center talked about “chance”

The Microbiologist is left of the German

The Geophysicist is left of Wright

The Microbiologist is between the Physician and Geophysicist

The 1880 birth year is left of Wright

The person who mentioned “opportunity” is right of Darwin

Wright discovered Genetic Drift

Darwin was a Naturalist

The American is in the last column

The Frenchman is left of Wegener
